#### *Notes from the Art Corner:*

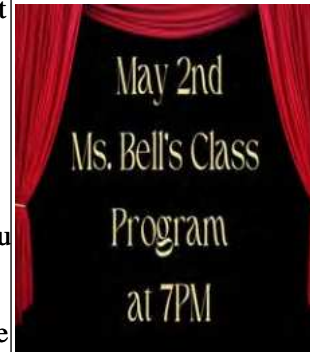
