Mrs. Sandi's Music Notes: This past month your children have really learned how to follow a conductor as well as practicing conducting themselves. Wowdo they have good rhythm! They are also doing such a great job at learning all the tricks to being a good musician:) In November, we will be learning some "call and response" songs to further their musical listening skills and boost confidence in when to sing and when to listen, which is a great left/right brain activity. Typically the teacher (me) does the calling (singing a phrase in a song) and the children are the responders (echoing back that phrase). I'm excited to have some of your children try being the caller as I have so many strong singers. We've studied four string instruments already this year. Now it's time to move on to woodwind instruments-the flute and the clarinet. We'll learn how to recognize these instruments by listening to "Peter and the Wolf." Our musical concepts this month are forte (loud) and piano (soft). If you have time, it would be fun to watch with your children Walt Disney's version of "Peter and the Wolf" narrated by David Bowie. It's only 14 minutes long and will give you and your child a chance to enjoy this amazing piece of music written by Sergei Prokofiev together Mrs. Sandi
