NORTHWEST HARVEST FOOD DRIVE

What types of food does Northwest Harvest need? They can use any non perishable food or monetary donations. If you prefer to donate food, select shelf-stable food with the lowest saturated fats and refined carbohydrates (sugar, white flour). They buy white rice and beans in bulk, so they encourage you to donate other items.



General food items: Oatmeal, Whole grain pastas, Brown rice, Tomato products, Canned vegetables, Canned fruit, Canned fish or meat, Shelf-stable milk, Beef stew, chili and similar meals with low sugar or saturated fats.

Infant and baby foods: Baby formula, Canned milk, Infant cereal, Jars of baby food, Powered or canned milk. They also accept baby diapers.

MIM will collect items November 6th through November 21st.
